### Baby Loss Awareness Day – 15 October 2007

On Monday the 15th October, we commemorated Baby Loss Awareness Day with a public meeting with eminent medical professionals. The event took place in Wynn's Hotel, Lower Abbey Street in Dublin.

We had a super attendance, almost a hundred in total. The room was nearly full but still comfortable. Some of our visitors had travelled a long way and we are grateful for their effort and support. There was a good mix of medical staff and concerned parents in the audience. At 7 o'clock we lit 100 candles, which we had brought along to be a part of the "wave of light" sweeping around the globe. We began the evening with refreshments to get people relaxed and comfortable.

After a brief introduction, we were treated to a wealth of information on the medical aspects of Miscarriage. Dr. Michael Geary, Master of the Rotunda Hospital gave a comprehensive treatment on the subject of Early Miscarriage. He was followed by Dr. Mary Anglim of the Coombe and St. James's Hospital, who dealt with Ectopic Pregnancy. The third speaker was Dr. Mary Wingfield of the National Maternity Hospital, who explored Recurrent Miscarriage. Finally, Dr. Shane Higgins of Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital in Drogheda gave a great insight into the subject of Late Miscarriage.

Each of the doctors presented a vast amount of information. It was clear that the medical profession is taking miscarriage seriously but it is also clear that there is still a lot to learn. We are very grateful for their sharing of knowledge and giving us more insight into the different areas of miscarriage. A bit later than planned, we opened up the session for questions from the audience. Quite a number were submitted in writing. Unfortunately, time did not permit to answer all the questions. Niamh Ryan, our Secretary brought proceedings to an end a little after 10 pm

The feedback from those who attended was that it was a very informative and worthwhile evening. Thanks and praise must go to our dedicated committee for their superb organization.
